

Drinking alcohol is prohibited on public transport

Drinking alcohol or carrying open containers of alcohol is prohibited on Tube, Bus, DLR and Tram services and stations.

This Direction to Leave is only one method to deal with certain types of anti social behaviour used by the police. If you behave in an anti social manner in public , on public transport or at public transport locations, you may also be liable to prosecution for some of the following offences, some of which can carry terms of imprisonment as well as fines:

IMPORTANT INFORMATION RE THIS NOTICE

You have been issued with a Direction to Leave notice under Section 27(3) of the Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006, which aims to minimise the likelihood of alcohol related crime & disorder in a specific area.

You must leave the area as directed for the time specified.

If you knowingly fail to comply with this Direction to Leave, Section 24 of the Police & Criminal Evidence Act provides a constable with a power of arrest.

There is no route of appeal for an individual

against the giving of a Direction to Leave. However, you may challenge whether the direction was properly made if you are prosecuted for the Breach of a Direction at a later date. A Direction to Leave can be withdrawn or varied by any police constable. This can be done at a police station or another suitable place proposed by a constable.

The direction should not prevent you from having access to where you live, from attending work, from attending your place of education or training or from seeking medical treatment, or from having access to a place that you have been ordered to attend, for example a court hearing or tribunal.

Your presence in this locality is believed to contribute to alcohol related crime or disorder. **YOU MAY NOT RETURN TO THIS AREA FOR THE PERIOD OF TIME STATED.** If you do you will be liable to arrest and may be charged with a criminal offence
